

THE CARLISLE HIGH SCHOOL MARCHING BAND

The Carlisle Area School District is proud to present the 1988-89 Carlisle High School Marching Band. The 190 member marching unit comprises 139 musicians, 38 band front members, 4 American unit members, and 7 runners and alternates. The band is led on the field by Drum Majors, Chris Holtry and Karen Sprengel.

The field show opens with a fanfare from "Beowulf" and is followed by "Procession of the Nobles". Following this classical opening, the musical style changes and the band performs the jazz selection "Granada", which includes a percussion feature. The 1988-89 field show closes with the theme song from East of Eden, "American Hymn".

Soloists in the field show include trumpeter Chip Bowes in "Granada", and trombone and flugal horn players, Matt Castrina and Chris Synder, in "American Hymn".

The band is directed by David Rohrer. Mark Gray is the Assistant Band Director and percussion arranger/instructor. Gary Greyhosky assists with percussion arrangements and instruction. Tom Rarick and RJ Greger are percussion instructors. The band front is instructed by Lori Rabeler and Adali Binger, with part-time assistance from Anneliese Moats and Joanna Wolford. Larry Hershman and John Hinkel are the Drill Designers. Marching instruction assistants are Dave Landis and Roger Wolf. Allen Roth assists with music and marching instruction and arranges the music for the band. Tim Wolf and Loren Disque are band managers.
